Leadership and Organizational Changes

The Board Executive completed a review of the past, and ongoing, performance of the Executive Director. The leadership and efficacy being provided by the Executive Director was deemed to be no longer in the best interest of the Foundation and as such the Executive Director was terminated on June 4, 2021.

With the conclusion of these changes, the Board of Directors commenced an operational role in order to help the Program Coordinator carry on the functions and operations of the Foundation until such time as a new leadership structure and executive direction could be implemented.

Helping Students in 2020-2021

The Fall of 2021 was the first school start during the height of the COVID 19 Global Pandemic. Many programs typically supported and/or executed by the Foundation were either cancelled, postponed or highly modified. In turn, the demand for, and increase of, student financial need requests greatly increased.

The Foundation Board of Directors worked very hard with sponsors and supporters to ensure the over \$90,000 in requests were funded. The collective efforts of all the stakeholders ensured we were able to fund all the requests making significant positive impacts on the lives of over 900 students in the District School Board of Niagara.
