Leadership and Organizational Changes

Throughout the 2021-2022 school year the Foundation continued to function with an operational volunteer Board of Directors and a full-time program coordinator

In February of 2022 a contract was executed for the appointment of a leadership and not-for-profit organizational consultant. This contract was completed in July of 2022. The content in the completed consultants report created a framework for the subsequent policy changes that the Board of Directors initiated. Prospecting for a new Executive Director was ongoing during which time the Board of Director reviewed and revised the Foundation by-laws and policies and procedures.

A complete set of new by-laws and organizational policies and procedures was scheduled to be ratified in September of 2022.

The commencement of the 2022-2023 corresponded with the implementation of the new by-laws, policies and procedures and the finalization for a new Executive Director Role.
